The beginning of the year 2021 started on a positive note for India with the introduction of the COVID vaccination campaign, which had decreased the stress levels of nation's citizens, which were high due to the new and unidentified COVID 19 virus and has sparked hopes that things will soon return to normal. But when a deadlier and more devastating second wave (Delta variation) of the pandemic hit the country in the month of April, the hope of living a normal life was crushed. The country's economy and the lives of the people have both been disturbed. The second wave is also having a bitter experience in Bihar. Additionally, it exposed the shortcomings of the State's healthcare system, including a shortage of vaccinations, hospital beds, and oxygen cylinders, and other medical equipment and supplies.

At the end of the calendar year, the third wave (Omicron) struck our state again and, causing widespread devastation. Two years of consecutive wave attacks caused by COVID - 19 had severely impacted the lives of ordinary people, particularly those from marginalised communities. It not only affects underprivileged communities, but it also has a negative impact on our development sectors, particularly small grass-roots organisations, due to a lack of funds as well as technical know-how to manage the new and deadly delta variant at the community and facility level.

We are happy to let you know that, despite having limited human and financial resources, the Bihar Voluntary Health Association has made a significant social contribution by assisting the state's underserved populations. Without the assistance of its network member groups in Bihar, this would not have been achieved.

During the year 2021-22, we at BVHA worked to improve the livelihood chances as well as the various health and related issues for the underprivileged communities in Bihar with the motto "Health - A reality for All" . During the year we put especial emphasis to provide support Govt. of Bihar to improve the COVID vaccination coverage and raising public awareness of the need to follow hand hygiene and physical distancing.

We sincerely thank each and every member of the Governing Board and General Body of BVHA for contributing their insightful ideas and supportive actions during the interventions and programme review in the board meeting. We would like to express our sincere gratitude to the network members for their assistance and support to meet the project's goals and objectives.

ABOUT BIHAR VOLUNTARY HEALTH ASSOCIATION (BVHA)



Bihar Voluntary Health Association (BVHA) is a registered society, registered under Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 at Patna, Bihar. BVHA was established in 1969 by Fr. James Stuart Tong with the support of Medical Mission Sisters of Kurji Holy Family Hospital with a belief *“Health - a reality for all”*. The idea was to create a secular association of Charitable Health Centers, Dispensaries, Hospitals and grass-root Voluntary Organizations who are engaged in Health & Health related development activities in their respective areas. At present, BVHA works to promote community health through its state-wide network of 150 member organizations and 300 associated organizations.

Since inception, mother and child health is prime focus of BVHA including the capacity building of CSOs /charitable hospitals/health centers to strengthen their service delivery mechanism. From mid-seventies to mid-eighties, BVHA was identified as nodal agency by Govt. of Bihar, Dept of Health for distribution of vaccines through its member CSOs/hospitals to provide services at the rural community people by maintaining proper cold chain.

BVHA is experienced in successful implementation of various community sensitization programs on health and its social determinants like community health, SRHR, menstrual hygiene, communicable and non-communicable diseases, child marriage etc. It has vast experience in creating enabling environment by convincing concerned officials, policy makers and policy implementers based on the evidences gathered from communities across Bihar. Capacity building of grass-root CSOs for its different levels of personnel as per their need and orientation of Govt. outreach frontline health service providers on various aspects are major interventions of BVHA. BVHA has direct reach to all the 38 Districts of Bihar through its network organizations.

BVHA has good experience in working with the health department of GoI and well as state govt., UN agencies mostly with Unicef and Unfpa, international and national development agencies in addressing various health and social development issues. BVHA has become a part of many network/forums/alliances to address many health and social issues jointly at various levels.

BVHA’s major strategies to intervene are Support to Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) by building capacity, Networking, Creating Enabling Environment / Advocacy and emergency Disaster Relief Work.

BVHA's philosophy is to make the community health a reality for the people of Bihar by initiating and strengthening people's organizations. Its major thrust is to develop the organizations so as to promote people's action for responding to their need.

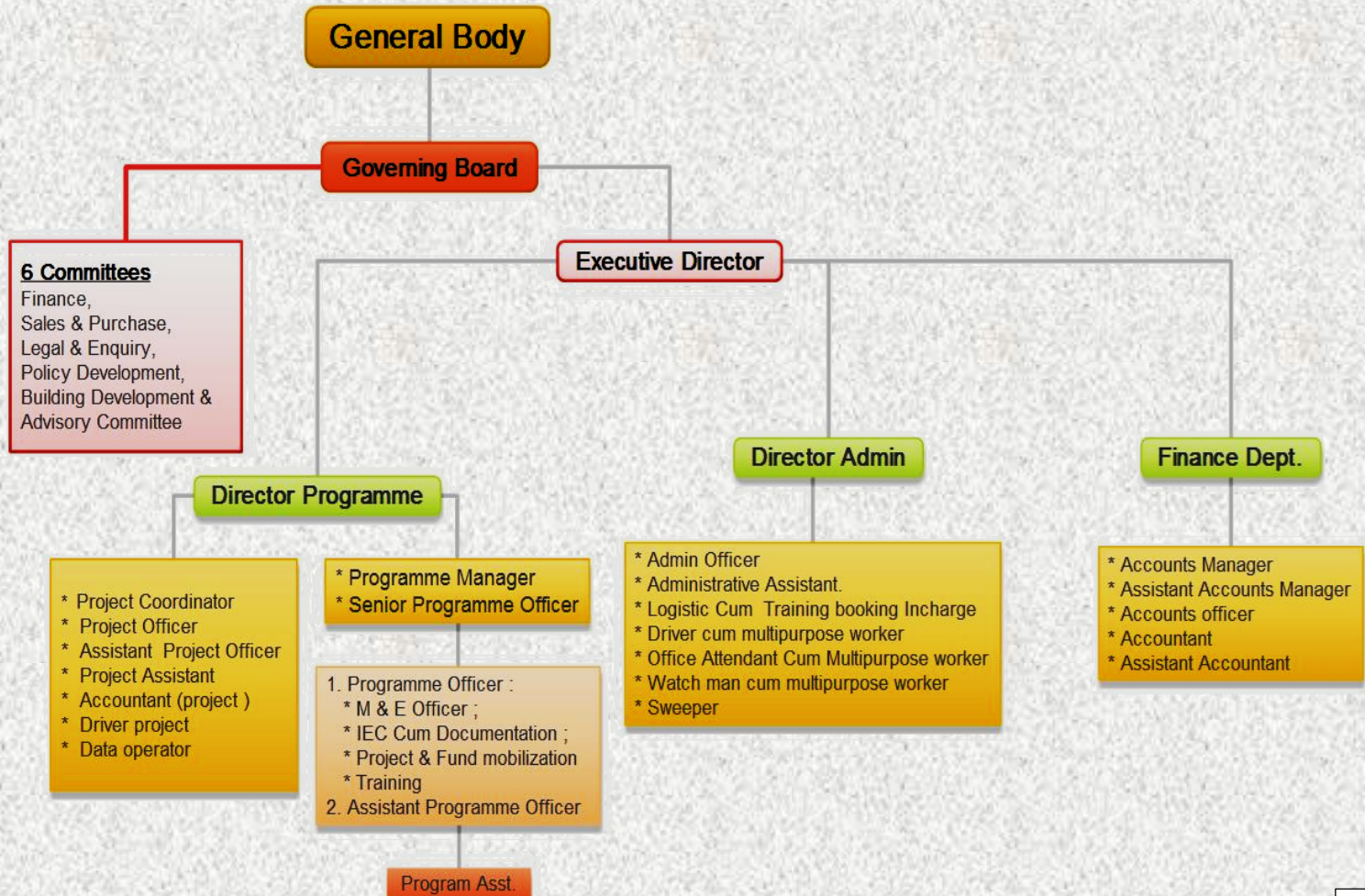


GOAL

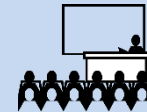

Every month mobile medical van moved in the project intervention villages as per the roster plan and provide health care services at the door steps of the rural people in Maner Block of Patna District.

OPD services has been provided with the support of doctors, ANM and Para-medical staffs. Apart from that Pathological test has been done as per the reference of doctors like haemoglobin, Blood Sugar, Hepatitis-B, HIV, Urine Routine, Malaria Parasite, Typhoid and Dengue.

Meeting with Adolescent groups on Personal Hygiene: 34 meeting with adolescent groups have been organized in which 570 participants participated.

Adolescent groups meeting on life-skills: 14 meetings with adolescent groups have been organized, in which 189 adolescent boys and girls participated.

- ❖ **Malnourished children refer to NRC:** 57 malnourished children have been referred to Nutritional Rehabilitation Centre, Masoudhi. The Malnourished children along with mother stayed at the NRC for complete treatment.

Maternal Health: Brief introduction on Safe Abortion

The project aims to strengthen the state level SRHR movement, stakeholders, media & health network/ CSOs/ NGOs for access to reproductive health services, especially for safe abortion. We are enabling conducive environment for better implementation of Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act 1971 with communities stakeholders & health providers MO & ANM, ASHA AWWs and Jiveeka Groups, Public representatives ward members/PRI, policy makers and civil societies to scale up project know how and access services at facility for safe abortion to reduces maternal death ratio. We also establish convergence with line departments as well as disseminate information through media coverage in newspaper/ electronic paper and social media in the right direction for community mobilization.

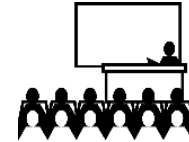

Helping women in need: Domestic Violence

BVHA has been fighting the battle against Domestic Violence by providing highest quality of resources and services like counseling, safe shelter, legal advocacy and outreach to schools, Corporates enforcement and the community through Project PANKHI. The project aims at providing counseling and rehabilitation to the women victims of domestic violence through a central helpline (PANKHI) counseling and face-to-face counseling services in accordance with The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005

We have successfully dealt 84 cases. We have given legal advice to 5 cases in which all are now leading a normal healthy life and the other 79 victims have got psychological support, individual and family counselling sessions that help them to live respectfully. During the lockdown period we tried to help victims not only through the phone and internet but we have also given physical assistance to 15 cases on the ground.

Pankhi project is actively working towards our awareness programmes and have conducted several webinars and spread awareness through Nukkad Natak.

We have successfully conducted 4 Nukkad Natak on the subject of Domestic violence in Patna district and it has received overwhelming response from the audience.

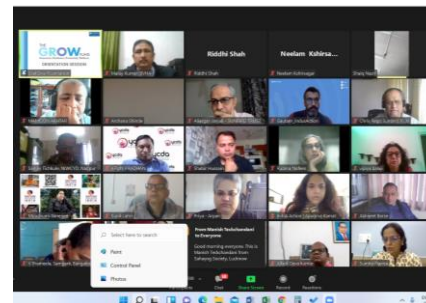

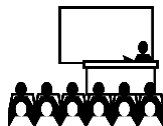

As we all know that despite the wide attention of UN Agencies, Government and other concerned agencies, modern slavery has attracted around the world. Likewise, in India slavery (Trafficking) cases have to be found in huge number across the states including Bihar.

Bihar being one amount the poor states of India with low literacy level, huge unemployment, poverty, poor access to services, poor enforcement law, socio-cultural background, regular natural calamities and lack of proper opportunities etc. makes this state more vulnerable and create space for trafficking.

As Bihar is bordering with Bangladesh and Nepal in one side and on the other side with West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh and Jharkhand, so, this state is considered as a “Source, Transit and Destination for trafficking”. As per the Government of India initiative to pass the “Immoral Trafficking Prevention Act (IPTA)”, the trafficking issues are highlighted and are recognized by all citizens and at the same time the all the state governments are supposed to implement the act strictly. But many states in Bihar have poor performance in this regard. Few committees are formed at the state & district level by the state government but not effectively functioning. So, there is stall fear of continuous trafficking cases in this state.

On the other side an active and strong coalition has been formed namely- CCHT (Collective Coalition Against Human Trafficking).

BVHA added value to CCHT

Bihar Voluntary Health Association is also associated with CCHT and also the Patna divisional secretariat. This secretariat covers six districts namely- Patna, Nalanda, Bhojpur, Rohtas, Buxar and Kaimur. Following activities have been carried out during the year by BVHA and CCHT members in these six districts.

Besides that BVHA has formed 10 Child Protection Committees (CPCs) in Maner block covering 10 panchayats. The newly elected Mukhia are now chairperson of these CPCs. Several visits were made to mobilize the PRI members and orientation program was organized with them separately in each selected panchayats.

Networking: An Important strategy of Bihar Voluntary Health Association (BVHA)

Bihar Voluntary Health Association is a networking organization of various Charitable Health Institutions, Civil Society organization, Individuals engaged in Community Health Promotion in Bihar & Jharkhand state. This is the strength of BVHA and it helps in effective and democratic functioning. BVHA has developed such networks in each & every district of Bihar & some districts in Jharkhand. **RESEARCH INSTITUTE OF SAHNI DRUG TRANSMISSION & HOMOEOPATHY
ANNUAL REPORT 2021-22**

About the Organization

Research Institute of Sahni Drug Transmission & Homoeopathy (RISDTH) was established in the year 1970 and got registered under the society registration act in 1974. The basic inspiration for establishment came from our founder Dr.B.Sahni, who is well known for his discovery in Transmission of Drug Energy from a Distance. Dr.B.Sahni sacrificed his life for the health of masses and rebuilding confidence in self-health without medicine. Thus he was also a great promoter of drugless therapies. Being an ardent follower of classical Homoeopathy, he went into the deeper aspect of dynamic and energy medicines of Homoeopathy and discovered the principle of remote application of medicines, which he followed for the rest of his life. Many people got inspired with the discovery and became his disciple. Need was felt to have a platform to promote and explore more into the energy medicine and its application for the promotion of health of masses. Thus Research Institute of Sahni Drug Transmission & Homoeopathy was born in 1970.

Research & Developments Activities:

Ongoing Projects

1. During the year RISDTH kept on all the previous research programme of conducting experimentation in drug transmission and in finding out the rules and guidelines in governing its practice.
Institute this year concentrated on the study of Mental symptoms through study of behavior of the patients. This included the study of Body language. On the basis of study literature were developed to educate about the Mind and its different faculty. Our Chairman presented papers on the Study of Mental Symptoms.
2. Institute worked and stressed on the finding out relationship of different Distance and effectiveness of medicine in different potencies.
3. During the year, a group has undertaken identification of local herbs to help habitants to use them for their related ailments. This is part of our objective to explore ways and means in self-sufficiency in medicines

New Projects

1. Our Institute which took project of compilation of rubrics and symptoms related to AIDS from available literature is continued. Progress is very encouraging and so far gathered information is being used for the treatment aspect in our clinics for verification.
2. In our Drug Transmission Projects we have created a group of scientist to explore into the dynamic aspect of Homoeopathic potency medicines.
3. This year OPD functioning progressed leap and bound as such it was made possible to use prescription based on Kent's philosophy thus scope of Repertory in OPD was found to be more effective.

Aulia Adhatmik Anusandhan Kendra, Vaishali

Disaster Response & Relief:

Aulia AA Kendra, Vaishali were supported to marginalized community during disaster Flood and Fire breakout. Organization was intervened during flood with the support of “GUNJ” covered 110 families for dry ration kits those were from most marginalized and downtrodden families.

During Fire breakout in PetriBelsar Block, Aulia AA kendra was intervened and supported 15 families for their rehabilitation process with the support of “GUNJ”. We were also intervened during sever cold wave in December 21, and supported 100 beneficiaries through distribution of Blanket among those who were suffered i.e., marginalized communities, old aged groups, physically challenged and women were the target beneficiaries.

30 families were supported through dry ration kits during COVID-19 pandemic with the support of S Foundation in Vaishali Block.

Mobilization/ Sensitization on MTP Acts 1971

We are implementing Ipas development foundation project on Abortion care and services on advocacy mode through community mobilization for better implement of MTP Act 1971 by access safe abortion services as per the act and its guideline. This is an Advocacy base project, we intervene to sensitize communities & front-line health workers, elected representatives, health services providers and media personnel to disseminate MTP act 1971 and its amendment 2021 in three operational blocks of Vaishali district. The stake holders are such as ASHA, ANM, AWWs, CDOPs, Jiveeka Leaders, CSs, Medical Officers, MLAs/MPs, NGOs, and Media personnel.

Promotion/ Campaign for Girl Education:

Aulia A A Kendra are initiating promotion of Girl Literacy Programme in Soriya Block of Muzaffarpur district under Right to education and mobilize/ sensitize to the downtrodden community stakeholders for importance of education and focused to Girls education through observed signature campaign event.



Bhojpur Mahila Kala Kendra, Ara

Upliftment of Dalit/ Mushar families through provide education, livelihood, Health and WASH programme initiated in 8 village of Ara Block- Bhojpur district-Bihar with the collaboration of AndheriHielf -Germany. Nanha Bachhapan (3-8 class) 100 children will involve in education- based intervention through playing game and craft. We are focusing with SHGs and capacitate on adolescent health, numerical literacy, SHGs banking practice and associates through livelihood initiatives.

During Corona period we are provide knowledge-based training and prepare Corona champions within communities and free camps were initiated within village and pre examine BP, Sugar, Fever and breathing with 300 people were the key beneficiaries with support of Barefoot Collage in our operational district.

220 families were benefited with dry ration during covid 19 pandemic situation in three blocks badhara, Agaion and Sandesh of Bhojpur districts with the support of Jio Diya Foundation.

We were initiating post COVID 19 interventions through community's awareness building/ mobilization for vaccination and remedial steps were taken on mis-conception towards the COVID-19 vaccination with the support of barefoot Collage in two blocks of Agiwa & Sandesh in Bhojpur district. We are covered 8846 people successfully under COVID-19 vaccination programme.

310 females were link to livelihood programme through skill development training in various alternative livelihood trades they are self-reliant and empower within village and their communities.



Bihar Gram Vikas parishad(BGVP)

Bihar Gram Vikas parishad is a voluntary/non-profit making organization working for rural, poor, adolescent girl, women and child development, small and marginalized farmer specially in the field of Health, education, livelihood, water, sanitation and sustainable agriculture among the ST, Dalit community, specially Musahar and disabled person and Widow to access to Government schemes. BGVP has organized the following activities during the year 2020-21

Promotion of Covid Vaccination in Sitamarhi district of Bihar state :- BGVP has created awareness among community for safety from Covid through COVID Appropriate Behaviour. BGVP has awared community from Cancer and World Women's day celebration was also organised in 15 villages. 2000 family and more than 4 Govt. officials have been benefitted through this programme. This Programme was organized by the support of **BVHA** (Project of **FICCL**)

Youth Change Maker (COVID-WARRIOR):- BGVP has trained 44 youth for community and youth awareness to save themselves, their family and their community from COVID by Covid Appropriate Behavior this awareness was done in the community and youth with the help of Snake and Ladder play. BGVP has organised World Children's day with support of Restless Development Foundation (SPWIPT)

Strengthening Community Level Structures and Prosecution System for Prevention of violence and Abuse against Children (Child Protection Committee Panchayat level)- In this programme BGVP has organised meetig in 100 Panchayat of 9 block of Sitamarhi district with help of Mukhiya, Upmukhiya, Sarpanch, Ward member, ASHA, Anganwari, Teacher and other prominent person of the Panchayat In meeting 100 Child Protection Committee (CPC) in 100 Panchayat has formed in the chairmanship of Mukhiya ji.

Covid19 Awareness – This programme was organised in BGVP office Premises. In this Promme Satya Narayan Mahato was resource person. In this programme 45 person were benefitted. This Programme was organized by **Local Contribution**.

Water and sanitation awareness: - In this programme we have organised awareness generation camps 35 women were awared about water and sanitation, Health and Hygiene in flood affected village Shiv Nagar of Runnisaidpur block of Sitamarhi District. This Programme was organized by **Local Contribution**.

Disaster Risk Mitigation Programme: - This programme was organized in organization premises in sitamarhi. In this programme 45 beneficiaries were awared for DRMP. **Awareness Programme on Govt. schemes for old age, begger, women and disabled person:-** This programme was organized in organization premises in sitamarhi. In this programme 30 beneficiaries were awared for Awareness Programme on Govt. schemes for old age, begger, women and disabled person, like old age person, senior citizen railways concession, senior citizen banks facilities, senior citizen right from their children etc.



Mahila Shishu Kalyan Sansthan Evam Hast Shilp Kala Prashiksan

Kendra , Manichapper, Po- Hathua, Dist. –Gopalganj

Mahila Shishu Kalyan Sansthan Evam Hast Shilp Kala Prashiksan Kendra (MSKS) is a grass-root level organization, which resisted under society act reg. began operation in 23 Aug. 1986. Our organization working for improve the lives of disadvantage children, their families and Communities. Since 1986 we have been working to help children access their rights to prepare health care, basic education and healthy environment. We have made tremendous efforts through our own local contribution and government funding and other foreign funding.

1. **Kushal Yuva Program:-** Skill training programme by the name of "Kushal Yuva Program" which would enhance the employability Skills of all aspirants in the age group of 15-28 years (Age limit for SC/ST, OBC & People with Disabilities is as follows: SC/ST - 33 years, OBC - 31 years, PwD - 33 years), who have passed at least 10th Class irrespective of their having attained higher education or their currently pursuing higher education. Soft Skills training would comprise of Life skills, Communications Skills (English & Hindi) and Basic computer literacy which in turn would enhance their employability.
2. **Sexual Reproductive Health:-** This program aims to empower girls to become drivers of change to make informed decisions about the & also support their peers to make decisions about sexuality, life goals, reproductive health, and enjoy their Sexual Reproductive Health Rights.
3. **Ambulance Service:-** Ambulance services in Gopalganj are available for patients who cannot travel independently to the hospital. The free ambulance service will take patients from their homes to the closest hospital or treatment facility.
4. **Vocational Training:** - 'Skills for Life' (Hunar) aimed at training 80 youths over a period of 12 months at training centers at Uchakagoan in Gopalganj . The program focused on increasing the income of young girls by enhancing their sector-specific skills such as Cutting & tailoring, Beauty and willengness. Over 100 students were trained, out of which nearly 40 got their own business.
5. **Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities:-** Under this program, work was done to connect the handicapped people with the Pension scheme run by the government and their medical certificates were also made. Survey of Divyanjan was done in 14 Panchayats of 14 blocks of Gopalganj district.

Activities During 2021-22

- Training of the women beneficiaries on their Reproductive health rights;
- Exposure on legal rights and entitlements of women,
- Promotion of leadership qualities among women.
- Make them part of the BBBP.

Mushroom Training: Mushroom cultivation training was conducted with the support of ICICI foundation at Bidupur Bazar Vaishali. During this training 35 women from deprived communities participated and get training to start their own mushroom cultivation.

Chandriila Samajik Uthan Avam Gramin Vikas Sansthan, Jamhor-Aurangabad established in 1986 and registered under Society Registration Act 1860. In 2021-22 several activities were initiated with the support of Collective Coalition against Human Trafficking (CCHT). CCHT is a state level network working in all 38 districts of Bihar.

- The organization is promoting awareness building campaign against child labour, unsafe migration and child trafficking related issues since inception with the collaboration of Indian RED Cross society & Rotary Club, Aurangabad chapter.
- Organization is initiating on sensitization on personal health hygiene water and sanitization during COVID-19 Pandemic for prevention of COVID-19 pandemic and distributed Hygiene Kits among the downtrodden communities.
- Organization was distributed MASK-N95 with Police personnel, Health providers and dignitaries within the communities and society during COVID-19 pandemic.

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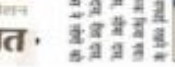
