Origin of BVHA and Brief Introduction:

Bihar Voluntary Health Association (BVHA) is a non-profit making organization established in 1969. It is an association of 167 Civil Society Organisations, charitable hospitals and health centres and more than 300 associated non-member organizations covering Bihar and Jharkhand States.

BVHA was formed by a visionary leader Fr James Stuart Tong SJ, Medical Mission Sisters and some likeminded social reformists with a noble vision to assist in making community health a reality for the people with priority to the less privileged millions. It got registered in February 1970 under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 at Patna, Bihar. Since inception it is working on improving health and wellbeing of people through promotion of community health.

BVHA is engaged continuously to increase organizational capacities of member and network partner organizations and address health and social needs of the communities. It is one of the pioneer members of Voluntary Health Association of India. It is contributing immensely by providing impetus and direction to the community health promotion in Bihar and Jharkhand.

In its initial years, BVHA dedicated its efforts to fortifying the expertise of charitable hospitals and health centers who are working in remote areas. Also, BVHA played an important role in providing support during natural calamities. As time unfolded, BVHA expanded its scope by initiating various interventions to address the unique healthcare necessities of marginalized individuals within society. Beyond this, BVHA empowers and enhances the capacity of CSOs to meet the health and societal requirements of their respective communities. undoubtedly, disaster response remains a paramount commitment for BVHA.



- Empowering the Economically Disadvantaged: BVHA's implementation efforts will focus on enabling individuals and communities with limited resources to actively pursue their own development and well-being.
- **2.** Capacity Building: In addition to project implementation, BVHA recognizes the importance of capacity building, which plays a vital role in achieving long-term impact and sustainability. BVHA's approach to capacity building includes:
 - Enhancing Institutional Capacity: BVHA will invest in strengthening its own institutional capacity by improving core competencies and expertise, ensuring the organization is well-prepared to address the evolving needs of marginalized communities.
 - Partnerships with CSOs and Healthcare Providers: BVHA will collaborate with Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and charitable healthcare service providers to enhance their expertise in addressing relevant health issues. This partnership approach ensures that knowledge and resources are shared for more comprehensive and effective solutions.
 - Strengthening Member Organizations: BVHA is committed to supporting and strengthening its member organizations by focusing on organizational development. This assistance includes governance, management, and programmatic support to ensure these organizations are better equipped to serve their communities.
- **3. Govt. Engagement:** Recognizing the significance of engaging with government officials and elected representatives to shape policies and practices, BVHA is working to shape health policies positively.
 - Engaging with Government Officials: BVHA will actively collaborate with government officials at various levels to promote the effective implementation of health services for the poor and marginalized. This may include consultations, policy discussions, and collaborations to facilitate change.

Alkem Anaemia Mukti Abhiyan is a project to work for the reduction of Anaemia among women of reproductive age group and adolescent girls, as well as to address malnutrition of children under 5 years. The target group includes 300 pregnant and lactating women, 300 adolescent girls, and 400 children under 5 years in 30 villages of Hathua Block in Gopalganj District.

Identification of anaemia is being done through primary screening via physical examination and Hb screening using a digital Haemoglobinometer. Based on the Haemoglobinometer readings, individuals are categorized as Normal, Mild, Moderate, or Severe anaemic. Subsequently, counselling and dietary advice are provided to mild and moderate cases, while severe cases are referred to the nearest Government Health facility for therapeutic treatment.

The screening of malnourished children is carried out through weighing the children and plotting their weight on a growth monitoring chart, along with MUAC (Mid-Upper Arm Circumference) measurement. The project also focuses on building awareness among mothers and guardians about appropriate and age-wise child feeding practices, the promotion of exclusive breastfeeding up to 6 months of age, and the introduction of complementary feeding after 6 months. Special attention is given to Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) and Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM) cases, with referral to nearest Nutrition Rehabilitation Centers (NRC) for therapeutic treatment in the case of SAM children.

Mobile Health Center, with the support of Americares India Foundation and SMFG India Credit Co. Ltd. (formerly Fullerton India Credit Co. Ltd.), is implementing OPD services in the hard-to-reach areas of Saran and Siwan Districts in Bihar. The aim is to provide immediate medical services to address the health needs of the rural and urban poor. Priority is given to women, children, and elderly persons, as they are the most vulnerable and in need of attention.

The intervention focuses on early screening for Diabetes and Hypertension, as well as providing the necessary treatment and referrals for critical and chronic cases to ensure better and ongoing treatment. The medical team of the project not only offers curative measures but also conducts health education sessions at the community level, promoting preventive health measures.

In Government middle and high schools, school students receive preventive health and hygiene care, recognizing them as valuable agents of change within the community. This approach aims to build their capacities for a healthy lifestyle and a healthier society.

BVHA is playing an important role on building the knowledge and skills of Targeted Intervention (TI) and Link Worker Scheme (LWS) staff. The project's cornerstone is the creation of Master Trainers in each state. These experts serve as knowledge center, training core TI and LWS staff to effectively combat HIV/AIDS. They also mentor and guide others, ensuring a lasting impact. By partnering with government bodies and NGOs, BVHA, with donor support, is not only imparting knowledge but also working towards eradicating HIV/AIDS stigma and sowing hope for an HIV/AIDS-free future in these states.

The Grassroots, Resilience, Ownership, and Wellness (GROW) Fund is a pioneering initiative aimed at enhancing the capabilities, resilience, and future preparedness of organizations. Anchored by the EdelGive Foundation and supported by a consortium of esteemed funders, the GROW Fund has a mission to strengthen 100 high-impact grassroots organizations over a span of 24 months. This is achieved through comprehensive capacity building and support for key organizational functions.

Organization's Website redesigned after website audit conducted by the GROW team. BVHA also collaborated with an expert to develop a 5-year Strategic Planning document, along with revising and refining its Mission and Vision statements. To further enhance BVHA's organizational capabilities, the GROW Capacity Building (CB) Desk, in conjunction with external resource persons hired by BVHA, organized a series of both virtual and in-person capacity-building sessions on various topics Financial Planning and Management, Risk Management, Proposal development, leadership development, Learning and Development etc. BVHA now are in process to develop its own PME software to facilitate real-time data collection from the field, thus aiding in decision-making processes. BVHA also conducted a workshop dedicated to crafting performance appraisal tools tailored to various positions within the organization. The GROW 100 initiative assists in managing and mitigating core costs of organizations, including day-to-day non-programmatic expenses.

The project, generously funded by the Azim Premji Foundation, is focused on improving the overall health and well-being of homeless populations in four high-density areas within Patna City. The primary objectives are as follows:

Enhancing Knowledge and Hygiene Practices: This is achieved through small and peer group community meetings, street medicine initiatives, and community awareness programs. These activities aim to educate homeless individuals about essential health and hygiene practices.

Increased Access to Healthcare Services: The project seeks to provide proper and timely treatment for illnesses by offering street medicine services and facilitating referrals to government hospitals. This ensures that homeless individuals have improved access to essential healthcare services.

Enhanced Access to Mental Health Services: Another critical aspect of the project involves improving access to mental health services. This is achieved through counseling, referrals to government hospitals, supporting treatment completion, and conducting follow-ups.

These efforts are concentrated in four high-density pockets or hotspots within Patna Urban namely Pataliputra Station, Sabari Nagar, Prem Nagar, and Jalalpur Nahar.

By addressing these objectives, the project aims to reduce morbidity and mortality rates among homeless populations while enhancing their overall well-being, particularly in areas with high homeless density in Patna City.

The 'Right to Be a Girl' project is dedicated to preventing child and early marriages in 10 villages of Choraut Block in the Sitamarhi District, where child marriage is prevalent. This initiative specifically targets 500 adolescent girls.

- Forming and strengthening girls' agencies and provide intensive training on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and life skills education, the project equips these girls with the knowledge to understand the harmful consequences of child and early marriages. By enhancing their knowledge and capacities, the project empowers them to actively oppose and speak out against child, early, or forced marriages.
- Additionally, the project focuses on strengthening school management committee members to ensure the consistent attendance of children, especially girls, and to track and support those who drop out.
- The formation and strengthening of Child Protection Committees are crucial components, ensuring the monitoring and follow-up of girls at risk.
- Community leaders, members of Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRI), and faith-based leaders play pivotal roles in mobilizing the community against early and child marriages, given their influential positions.

Through awareness-raising and community engagement, the project strives to create a safer environment for young girls. The ultimate goal is to provide them with the opportunity to enjoy their right to a childhood and an education, free from the constraints imposed by early marriages.

With financial support from LICHFL, Mumbai, BVHA has developed an innovative Mobile Awareness Vehicle equipped with a large multimedia screen and required audio attachment suitable for large audience. This vehicle is designed to facilitate various community awareness campaigns and initiatives, including topics like safe drinking water, child marriage, communicable diseases, non-communicable diseases, malnutrition, and anemia. This mobile unit travels from village to village, showcasing informative documentary films, sharing real-life case studies, and presenting animated videos to engage audiences of all backgrounds and ages.

Through this vehicle, BVHA not only imparts crucial health education and information but also offers screening services for conditions like diabetes, anemia, and hypertension. An expert medical team conducts these screenings and provides counseling to patients based on the test results, ensuring that individuals receive appropriate guidance and referrals when necessary. This innovative approach helps reach communities with valuable health resources and information directly.

The Bihar Sustainable Livelihood Development (BSLD) project, supported by Heifer International, aims to increase the income of 4000 vulnerable households, primarily represented by women, in the Choraut Block of Sitamarhi District.

Major Project Interventions are:

- Empowerment and Institutional Strengthening: This component focuses on empowering women and building social capital.
- **Community Organization:** The project aims to organize, create, and strengthen women-led community organizations.
- **Livelihood Improvement:** Activities include promoting goat farming, backyard poultry, and agricultural initiatives to enhance livelihoods.
- **Promotion of Natural Farming:** This involves advocating for natural (organic) farming practices, as well as promoting techniques like Vermicompost, SRI (System of Rice Intensification), and SWI (System of Wheat Intensification) Cultivation.
- Marketing System: The project also works on establishing or strengthening marketing systems to support the sale of products from these livelihood initiatives.

With the support of Heifer International, the BSLD project seeks to improve the economic well-being of vulnerable households, especially those represented by women, in the Choraut Block of Sitamarhi District.

issue on the agenda of Gram Sabha meetings. The project also engages in evidence-based support to work in close coordination with relevant government departments, including the Public Health Engineering Department (PHED), Education, Health, and Appropriate Authorities.

Key Project Activities:

- **Awareness Raising Meetings/Campaigns:** Conducting meetings and campaigns to raise awareness about the importance of safe drinking water and arsenic mitigation.
- Orientation of Various Stakeholders: Providing training and orientation sessions to various stakeholders on arsenic mitigation strategies and practices.
- **School Sensitization Program:** Educating school students about the significance of safe drinking water and arsenic-related concerns.
- Water Sample Testing: Testing water samples from community hand-pumps to measure arsenic contamination levels and inform the community about those hazardous water resources.
- **Strengthening Community Institutions:** Empowering and reinforcing community institutions to take a proactive role in ensuring safe drinking water access.
- Liaison with Government: Collaborating with government authorities to identify alternative drinking water sources, particularly in areas highly affected by arsenic contamination.

Through these efforts, the project aims to make safe drinking water accessible to a significant number of families and engage the community and relevant authorities in addressing the issue of arsenic contamination effectively.

Cataract Eye Operation project is mainly focusing to provide eye health services, specifically cataract surgeries, with the support of Alkem Foundation, Mumbai, in the Kaimur District.

Project Activities:

- 1. **Community Mobilization and Awareness:** BVHA conducts community mobilization activities and awareness campaigns to prepare the community for the upcoming eye cataract operation camps.
- 2. **Screening Camps:** Various screening camps are organized to identify individuals with cataracts or refractive errors who require eye care services.
- 3. **Transport to Base Hospital:** Patients identified during screening are transported to the base hospital, where cataract surgeries are performed following established protocols and safety measures.
- 4. **Post-surgery Care:** After surgery, patients are safely transported back to their homes, and post-surgery follow-up is an integral part of the project to ensure their recovery and well-being.

A total of 900 families have benefited, 112 patients had their eyes examined through OPD services, 62 cataract patients were identified and 53 cataract surgeries were successfully performed.

This project plays a crucial role in addressing eye health issues within the community and providing essential eye care services to those in need.

BVHA's Member Strength:

At present, BVHA has 167 member organizations (Civil Society Organizations, Charitable Health care service providing Institutions) engaged in Health & Health related development activities. and about another 300 voluntary Organizations are associated with BVHA through various programs and Alliances.

Organizational Structure and Decision Making

General Body: BVHA's decision-making authority resides in its General Body, which comprises 167 member organizations from Bihar and Jharkhand. General Body meetings are held annually and can be convened more frequently if necessary. This body plays a vital role in approving the Annual Activity Report, Audit Report, the selection of BVHA's auditor, and shaping policy decisions to enhance BVHA's programs and operations.

Governing Board: From the General Body, 11 members are elected as Governing Board Members, serving two-year terms extendable for an additional two years. The Governing Board meets at least quarterly to review BVHA's activities and make policy decisions. This board provides guidance and oversight for BVHA's programs and operations.

Executive Leadership: Day-to-day program management and administration are under the purview of BVHA's Executive Director. The Director Program and Director Admin assist in program implementation, working closely with the core program team to follow the directives set by the Governing Board.


In addition to these committees, BVHA may constitute special committees as needed, involving Governing Board members and subject experts from both the General Body and external experts.

Implementation Strategy of BVHA Programs:

BVHA primarily implements its projects and programs through two distinct approaches: Direct Intervention and Indirect Intervention via its Network Organizations.

In the case of **Direct Intervention**, BVHA directly manages and implements projects on the ground by recruiting personnel and overseeing the projects either from its Head Office or by establishing project offices.

On the other hand, with **Indirect Intervention**, BVHA collaborates with its member or network organizations. In this approach, the on-the-ground implementation of projects is carried out by partner organizations, who operate under the direct supervision and monitoring of BVHA project leads.



Organizational Infrastructure:

Bihar Voluntary Health Association has its own three-storeyed building equipped with modern facilities.

- The building has 10 well-equipped office rooms furnished with furniture and fixtures.
- A spacious AC-equipped Conference Hall having siting capacity up to 80 people, along with a smaller AC conference hall for 30 individuals, are available.
- The Conference Halls are equipped with a public address system and an LCD projector.
- Accommodation choices comprise guest rooms, double beds, triple beds, and dormitories, with a capacity for 50 occupants.
- A dedicated dining hall and catering services are conveniently accessible.
- The facility benefits include round-the-clock electricity via a generator, Wi-fi, First Aid Services, drinking water supply for the participants / delegates.
- BVHA possesses both two and four-wheeler vehicles.
- BVHA has 2 Mobile Medical Units (Force Ambulance modified for MMU)
- A multimedia awareness van for community awareness programmes.
- Sufficient parking space is provided for motor bikes and cars, ensuring convenience for employees and visitors alike.

Significant achievements over the past five years:

Significant achievements of BVHA have been listed below:

- 1. Capacity Enhancement of 300 CSOs: BVHA has been instrumental in enhancing the capacities of over 300 Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) over the past five years. These organizations have not only grown in strength but have also been supported in becoming active members of various forums and committees, allowing them to have a more significant impact on the issues they address. BVHA's efforts have played a crucial role in building a robust civil society that contributes effectively to societal development.
- 2. Improved Nutritional Status of 2500 Children, Women, and Adolescents: BVHA's dedicated interventions have led to a tangible improvement in the nutritional status of 2500 children, women, and adolescents. By implementing various strategies, including growth monitoring, counseling, promoting locally available nutritious food, and encouraging kitchen gardening, BVHA has made a substantial difference in addressing malnutrition within marginalized families.
- 3. **Mobilizing 300,000 Children for MR Vaccination**: BVHA's commendable work in mobilizing approximately 300,000 children for Measles-Rubella (MR) vaccination across 26 districts of Bihar has significantly contributed to public health. This achievement underscores BVHA's commitment to ensuring the health and well-being of the younger generation.
- 4. **Support for People with Disabilities (PwD)**: BVHA has listed and provided support to 5600 people with disabilities. This effort includes vaccination of 1200 PwD individuals for COVID, demonstrating BVHA's commitment to inclusivity and ensuring that vulnerable populations receive necessary healthcare support.
- 5. **Facilitating High COVID Vaccination Coverage**: BVHA has played a pivotal role in facilitating the achievement of 90% COVID vaccination coverage in one block and ensuring that 6400 individuals in four blocks receive the COVID vaccine. This reflects BVHA's commitment to public health and its efforts to combat the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 6. **Eye Health Initiatives**: BVHA has conducted extensive eye check-ups for approximately 700,000 school children, addressing potential eye health issues at an early age. Additionally, BVHA has performed around 4000 cataract operations, particularly for the elderly, thereby improving the vision and overall quality of life for these individuals.
- 7. **Empowering Adolescent Groups against Child Marriage**: BVHA has formed and strengthened 600 adolescent groups, empowering 12,000 adolescents to raise their voices against child marriage and advocate for their sexual, reproductive health, and rights. This initiative has a profound impact on safeguarding the rights and well-being of young girls.
- 8. **Support during COVID-19 Pandemic and Disasters**: BVHA has been a reliable source of support during critical times, extending assistance to 10,000 families affected by the COVID-19 pandemic and various disasters. This underscores BVHA's commitment to community well-being, even in challenging circumstances.
- 9. **Vocational Training for Youth**: BVHA has provided vocational training to 1200 young individuals, enabling them to acquire skills that enhance their employability and economic prospects, contributing to their personal and community development.
- 10. Support for Women in Animal Husbandry & Agriculture: BVHA's support for 3000 women engaged in goat farming and agriculture promotion has empowered women to be more self-reliant and contribute to their household income, promoting economic independence and sustainable livelihoods.
- 11. **Safe Drinking Water Initiatives**: BVHA's installation of 50 deep-bore handpumps in flood or arsenic-affected villages has improved access to safe drinking water,

- addressing a fundamental need of these communities. The testing of 2000 water sources for arsenic contamination has also created awareness about the importance of clean and safe drinking water.
- 12. **Sensitization on Domestic Violence**: BVHA has sensitized 1000 women and girls in Patna slums about domestic violence and gender-based violence. The provision of counseling to survivors and assistance in addressing these issues, including legal support, demonstrates BVHA's commitment to the safety and well-being of vulnerable individuals.
- 13. Engaging Government for Policy Formulation and Implementation: BVHA's active engagement with the government at various levels, including political leaders and policymakers, has resulted in successful advocacy for favorable policy formulation and implementation. This underscores BVHA's role in shaping policies that positively impact the communities it serves.
