Bihar Voluntary Health Association (BVHA) works to promote community health with the aim “Health for all” for underprivileged communities through voluntary action and puts its efforts to make a network of voluntary organizations directly associated with the masses and responding to their health needs.

## Origin of BVHA and Brief Introduction:

Bihar Voluntary Health Association (BVHA) is a non-profit organization that has been working since 1969 to improve the health and wellbeing of people in Bihar and Jharkhand. It was registered in **February 1970 under Societies Registration Act 1860**. BVHA was founded by Fr. James Stuart Tong SJ, Medical Mission Sisters, and other social reformers with a vision to make **community health a reality**, especially for the underprivileged.

BVHA is not just an organization—it is a **strong health network** connecting **129 Civil Society Organizations (CSOs)** and **charitable healthcare service providers**, along with **200 associated non-member organizations** working across Bihar and Jharkhand. Over the years, BVHA has grown from supporting charitable healthcare service providers in remote areas to implementing various health-focused projects aimed at **improving public health, empowering communities, and creating lasting change**.

BVHA focuses on **community health, nutrition and sanitation (WASH), HIV/AIDS, child protection, mobile health services, mental health, prevention of child marriage, and livelihood development**. It provides direct support through mobile health units, health screenings, telemedicine, and emergency relief programs. BVHA also train CSOs, healthcare providers, and field workers to improve healthcare accessibility, health education, and community development.

As a key member of the **Voluntary Health Association of India (VHAI)**, BVHA plays a crucial role in **strengthening the healthcare system**, advocating for better policies, and ensuring sustainable health interventions for the poorest communities. With a mission to promote preventive, promotive, curative, and rehabilitative healthcare, BVHA continues to make a difference by empowering people, advocating for rights, and creating a healthier future for Bihar and Jharkhand.

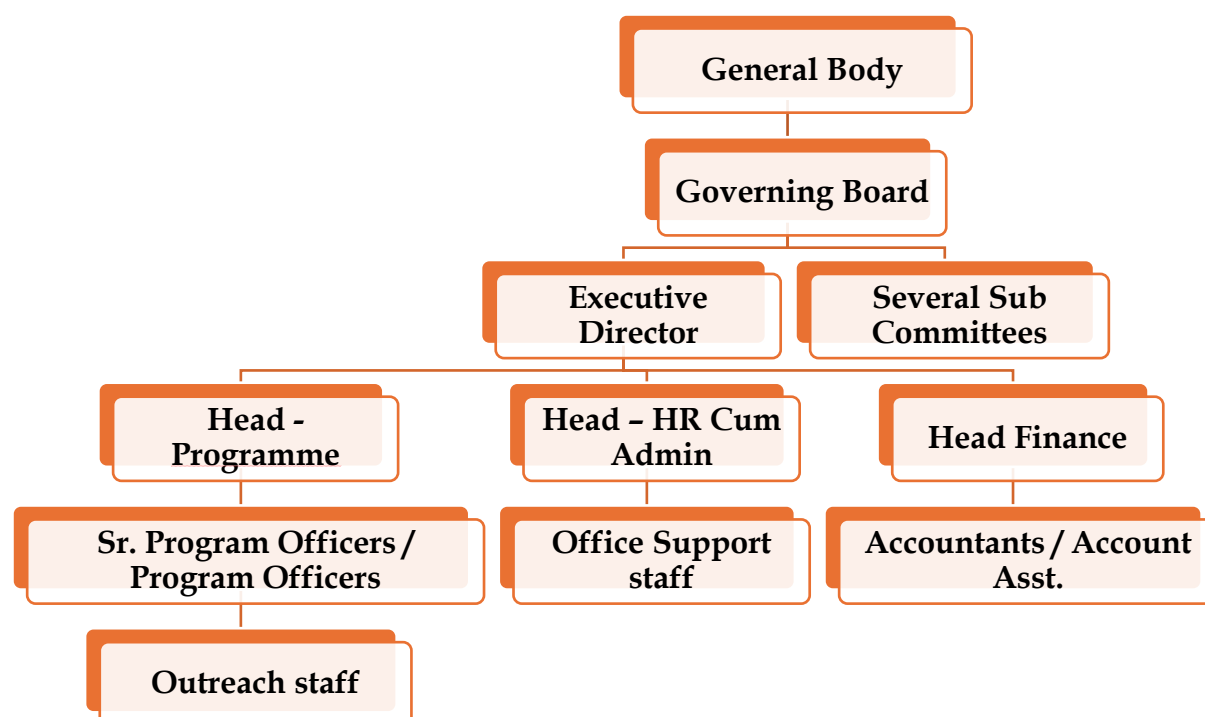

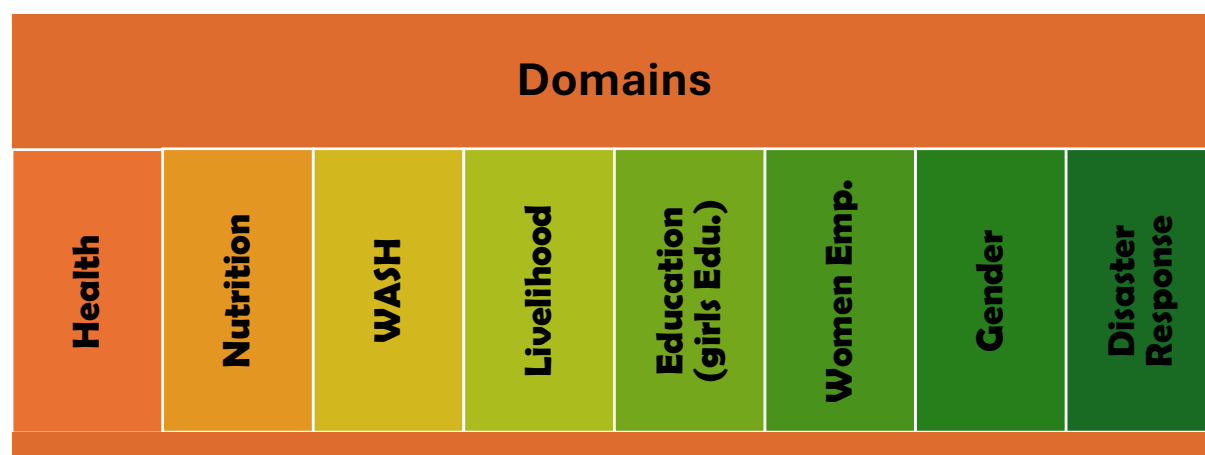

## 5 Years Strategic Plan of BVHA – 2023-28

As Bihar Voluntary Health Association completed five-decade, organization focuses with this strategic plan to step forward the next level of its excellence. The plan honors our founding commitment to serve the poor and marginalized communities of Bihar and Jharkhand. The strategic plan provide direction, providing a focus and helps the organization to decide priorities for next 5 years i.e. 2023-28.

### **BVHA's Threefold Roles for the Next 5 Years:**

1. **Implementation:** BVHA will continue to identify and address key health and social issues, focusing on marginalized communities. Projects will be implemented directly or through competent network members, empowering people in villages, slums, and urban areas to pursue self-development.
2. **Capacity Building:** BVHA will strengthen its own capacity and that of partner organizations, focusing on health and social development, so they can reflect BVHA's vision in their communities.
3. **Govt. Engagement:** BVHA will engage with government officials and committees to influence health policy and improve service delivery for the poor and marginalized.

### **Program Priorities:**

1. **Sexual and Reproductive Health:** Focus on maternal health, family planning, and adolescent health, targeting women aged 15-35 and adolescents aged 10-19.
2. **Malnutrition & Anaemia:** Address malnutrition and anaemia among pregnant women, adolescents, and young children.
3. **Communicable, Non-Communicable, and Vector-Borne Diseases:** Raise awareness and improve healthcare for diseases like TB, HIV/AIDS, and hypertension.
4. **Child Marriage:** Delay child marriage by working with children and youth aged 10-18 years, promoting education and sexual and reproductive health.
5. **Health Care Access:** Improve healthcare services in the hard to reach areas, for homeless and slum dwellers, promoting AYUSH.
6. **Mental Health:** Pilot programs on mental health, providing psychosocial care to youth, married couples, and the homeless.
7. **Safe Drinking Water and Sanitation:** Promote access to safe drinking water and improved sanitation.
8. **Climate-Resilient Livelihoods:** Promote sustainable livelihoods like goat farming, organic farming, back yard poultry, reducing climate vulnerability.

BVHA's programs will cover Bihar and Jharkhand, expanding based on need and focusing on creating models for replication, collaboration, and government engagement.

<b>Alkem Anaemia Mukti Abhiyan</b>	<b>Alkem Foundation, Mumbai</b>	<b>Hathua Block of Gopalganj District</b>	<b>Anaemia and Malnutrition</b>
The Alkem Anaemia Mukti Abhiyan aims to reduce anaemia among women and adolescent girls and tackle malnutrition in children under 5 years in Hathua Block, Gopalganj District. The project targets 300 pregnant and lactating women, 300 adolescent girls, and 400 children. Anaemia is identified through physical exams and Hb screenings. Mild and moderate cases get counselling and dietary advice, while severe cases are referred for medical treatment. Malnutrition screening involves growth monitoring and MUAC measurements. The project promotes awareness on proper child feeding practices and refers Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) cases to Nutrition Rehabilitation Centers.

Bihar Voluntary Health Association (BVHA) has been designated as a Regional Training Institute by the National AIDS Control Organization (NACO), Government of India under <b>Kshamta Kendra</b> for Bihar, Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh states. BVHA trains Targeted Intervention (TI) and Link Worker Scheme (LWS) staff to combat HIV/AIDS. The project focuses on building the capacities of staff of TI partner organizations. Through partnerships with government and NGOs, BVHA is working to spread knowledge, reduce HIV/AIDS stigma, and create hope for an HIV/AIDS-free future.			
<b>Mobile Health Care for Homeless Population</b>	<b>Azim Premji Foundation</b>	<b>4 hotspots in Patna Urban</b>	<b>Health Care for Homeless Population</b>
The project, funded by the Azim Premji Foundation, focuses on improving health and well-being among homeless populations in four high-density areas of Patna City: Pataliputra Station, Sabari Nagar, Prem Nagar, and Jalalpur Nahar. Activities focused on educating the homeless population on health and hygiene through community meetings and awareness programs, providing timely healthcare access via street medicine services and hospital referrals, and enhancing mental health support through counseling, referrals, and follow-up care. The project aims to reduce illness and improve the overall well-being of homeless individuals in these areas.			
<b>Tobacco Free Educational Institute</b>	<b>Education Dept, Govt. of Bihar</b>	<b>Purnea, Katihar, Araria, Saharsa, Kishanganj</b>	<b>Implementation of ToFEI guideline in 350 schools</b>
BVHA has been selected as an agency to implement Tobacco Free Educational Institute guidelines in 5 districts in Bihar by Education Dept, Govt. of Bihar. BVHA will work in 70 schools in each district, thus covering 350 schools in 5 districts. As per the India's tobacco control law, the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act, 2003 (COTPA), discourages tobacco use with provisions like bans on public smoking and sales to minors, and mandatory health warnings. This collaboration with the Education Dept of Govt. of Bihar project in Bihar aims to create Tobacco-Free Schools by raising awareness, engaging school communities, and ensuring compliance with the Act. It involves liaison with Govt. dept, sensitization and training of school teachers, community engagement, and using school events to promote tobacco control.			
<b>The Right to be a Girl</b>	<b>Mundo Cooperante, Spain</b>	<b>Choraut Block, Sitamarhi</b>	<b>Child Marriage Girl's Education.</b>
The "Right to Be a Girl" project aims to prevent child and early marriages in 10 villages of Choraut Block, Sitamarhi District, targeting 500 adolescent girls. The project focuses on empowering girls through training on Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR) and life skills, strengthening school management to ensure consistent attendance and support for dropouts, forming and building the capacity of Child Protection Committees to monitor at-risk girls, and engaging community leaders, PRI members, and faith-based leaders to mobilize against early marriages. This initiative seeks to create a safe environment, allowing girls to enjoy their childhood and education, free from early marriage pressures.			

<b>Promotion of Mental Health</b>	<b>Terre des Homes Germany</b>	<b>Sonepur Block, Saran</b>	<b>Mental Health among young people</b>
This project aims to address mental health issues among adolescents, youth, and families from marginalized communities in five villages of Sonepur Block, Saran. Targeting 150 adolescents, 100 youth, and 500 families, it seeks to understand and mitigate factors causing anxiety, stress, and other mental health problems. Interventions include promoting healthy lifestyles, sports, career counselling, and psychosocial support. The project will also train selected youth as mental health Youth Ambassadors to foster community mental well-being.			
<b>Health Wellness and Equity Project</b>	<b>VHAI, New Delhi</b>	<b>Hathua Block, Gopalganj Dist</b>	<b>Health Promotion</b>
In Hathua Block, the Health & Wellness Project will run to help rural families—especially women, adolescents, and disadvantaged groups—learn better ways to stay healthy, eat well, and keep clean. Local facilitators will hold interactive sessions in villages using simple, culturally familiar materials and practical demos. By connecting people to government health services and encouraging everyday healthy habits, the project aims to reduce illness, improve nutrition, and build a healthier community that can sustain these changes.

Through ProEngage, a Tata Sustainability Group program, skilled volunteers are supporting BVHA by transforming its social media for greater visibility and streamlining its organizational policies and procedures. Volunteers will work together for 6 months and will improve social media platforms, create content calendars, boost LinkedIn engagement, and coordinate website updates, gaining experience in nonprofit social media management and impactful storytelling. Additionally, they will enhance operational efficiency by reviewing policies, developing Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), identifying gaps, recommending improvements, and collaborating with HR, Admin, and leadership teams to draft detailed SOPs.			
<b>Mobile Health Services</b>	<b>SEVAMOB, Lucknow</b>	<b>Saran and Siwan District</b>	<b>OPD Health Services</b>
Mobile Health Service project is being implemented with the support of SMFG India Credit Co. Ltd. (formerly Fullerton India Credit Co. Ltd.) through SEVAMOB, Lucknow. The project will provide OPD health services through Mobile Health Services in the hard-to-reach areas of Saran and Siwan Districts in Bihar. The project aims to provide immediate medical services to the rural and urban poor, prioritizing women, children, and the elderly, who are the most vulnerable. Key activities include early screening for Diabetes and Hypertension, providing necessary treatments, and making referrals for critical and chronic cases. Also to conduct health education sessions at the community level and school level, promoting preventive health measures.

The project aims to provide arsenic-free, safe drinking water to 5,000 families and empower local stakeholders, including PRI members, women's groups, and youth, to promote safe water practices. Key activities include testing water samples for arsenic contamination, conducting awareness campaigns on safe water and arsenic issues, training stakeholders on arsenic mitigation, educating students through school programs, strengthening community institutions for safe water access, and collaborating with government agencies to find alternative water sources. The goal is to improve water safety and involve the community in tackling arsenic contamination.			
<b>Sanjeevani Telemedicine</b>	<b>LIC Housing Finance Ltd., Mumbai</b>	<b>Chakki and Brahmpur Block of Buxar</b>	<b>OPD health services through Telemedicine and Screening of NCD, Health education</b>
With support from LICHL, Mumbai, BVHA, received a Mobile Awareness Vehicle equipped with a large multimedia screen and audio system for health education. Now this year, BVHA uses this vehicle to operates a Mobile Health Unit (MHU) in Chakki and Brampur blocks, delivering on-site telemedicine healthcare services. The medical team conducts screenings diseases,consult the patient with online telemedicine consultation with expert doctor and provides free medicines. It also offers health education on anemia, malnutrition, hygiene, and chronic diseases. Community mobilizers ensure participation, identify vulnerable groups, and promote health awareness. Digital tools streamline patient registration and follow-ups, ensuring affordable, quality healthcare for underserved communities.			
<b>Mental Health Awareness</b>	<b>Self funded</b>	<b>Patna</b>	<b>Mental health among young people</b>
BVHA conducts mental health awareness and career counseling sessions for senior students in various private and government high schools. These sessions are supported by technical guidance from MPower (a unit of Aditya Birla Education Trust, Mumbai) and BVHA's expert career counselor. The main objectives are to raise awareness about mental health issues, address concerns, and promote early diagnosis among the youth. Participants are provided with an online self-assessment tool to evaluate their mental health, as many face stress due to academic pressures. Career counseling also helps students explore future career options and alleviate related concerns.			
<b>Eye Health for Children</b>	<b>Lenskart Foundation</b>	<b>Patna Slums</b>	<b>Eye health for children</b>
The Lenskart Foundation has partnered with BVHA to establish a charitable eye care center for underprivileged children and adults. The center will operate at the BVHA facility in Patna, providing free eye tests and corrective glasses. This non-financial collaboration aims to promote the Child Eye Care Centre among local communities. BVHA is responsible for providing the facility space and raising awareness about the center to ensure local residents benefit from the services offered.			
<b>Eye Cataract Operation Camps</b>	<b>Alkem Foundation, Mumbai</b>	<b>Kaimur District</b>	<b>Eye health</b>
The Cataract Eye Operation project, supported by the Alkem Foundation, aims to provide eye care services, including cataract surgeries, in Kaimur District. BVHA organizes community awareness campaigns, screening camps to identify individuals needing eye care, and transports patients to the base hospital for surgeries. Patients receive follow-up care and are taken back home after surgery. The project has benefited 900 families, with 112 eye examinations, 62 cataract cases identified, and 53 surgeries performed.

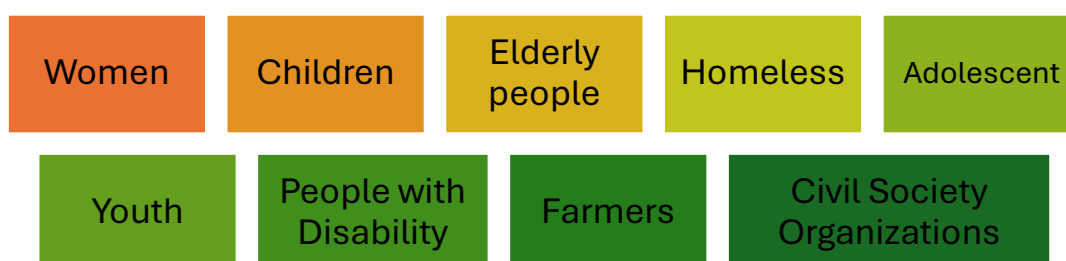

## BVHA's Member Strength:

Currently, BVHA has 129 member organizations, including Civil Society Organizations and Charitable Healthcare Service Provider Institutions, engaged in health and related development activities and also around 300 CSOs are associated with BVHA through various programs and alliances.

## Organizational Structure and Decision Making

**General Body:** BVHA's decision-making authority resides in its General Body, which comprises 129 member organizations from Bihar and Jharkhand. General Body meetings are held annually and can be convened more frequently if necessary. This body plays a vital role

in approving the Annual Activity Report, Audit Report, the selection of BVHA's auditor, and shaping policy decisions to enhance BVHA's programs and operations.

**Governing Board:** From the General Body, 11 members are elected as Governing Board Members, serving two-year terms extendable for an additional two years. The Governing Board meets at least quarterly to review BVHA's activities and finance and make policy decisions. This board provides guidance and oversight for BVHA's programs and operations.

**Executive Leadership:** Day-to-day program management and administration are under the purview of BVHA's Executive Director. The Director Program and Director Admin assist in program implementation, working closely with the core program team to follow the directives set by the Governing Board.

In addition to these committees, BVHA may constitute special committees as needed, involving Governing Board members and subject experts from both the General Body and external experts.

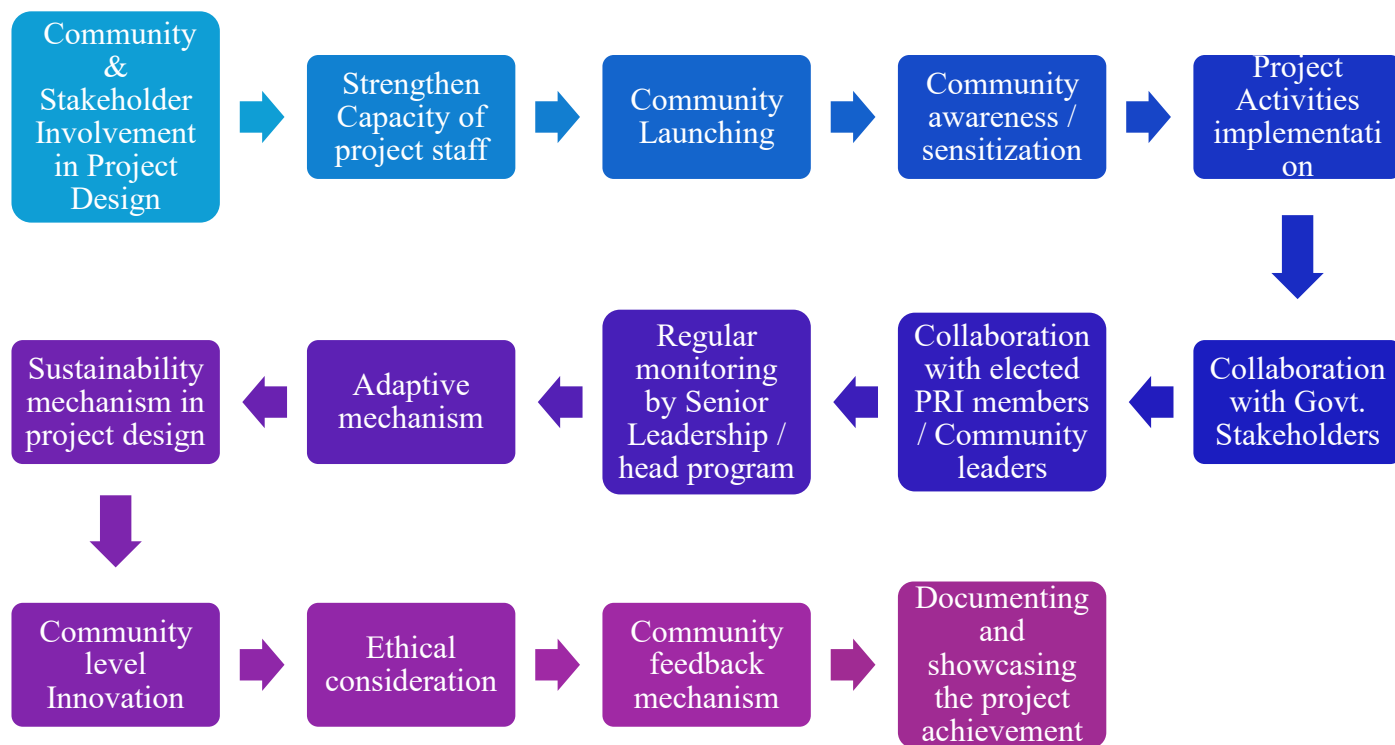
## Implementation Strategy of BVHA Programs:

BVHA primarily implements its projects and programs through two distinct approaches: Direct Intervention and Indirect Intervention via its Network Organizations.

In the case of **Direct Intervention**, BVHA directly manages and implements projects on the ground by recruiting personnel and overseeing the projects either from its Head Office or by establishing project offices.

On the other hand, with **Indirect Intervention**, BVHA collaborates with its member or network organizations. In this approach, the on-the-ground implementation of projects is carried out by partner organizations, who operate under the direct supervision and monitoring of BVHA project leads.

## Project Implementation Strategies of BVHA:



## Organizational Infrastructure:

Bihar Voluntary Health Association has its own three-storied building equipped with modern facilities.

- The building has 10 well-equipped office rooms furnished with furniture and fixtures.
- A spacious AC-equipped Conference Hall having sitting capacity up to 80 people, along with a smaller AC conference hall for 30 individuals, are available.
- The Conference Halls are equipped with a public address system and an LCD projector.
- Accommodation choices comprise guest rooms, double beds, triple beds, and dormitories, with a capacity for 50 occupants.
- A dedicated dining hall and catering services are conveniently accessible.
- The facility benefits include round-the-clock electricity via a generator, Wi-fi, First Aid Services, drinking water supply for the participants / delegates.
- BVHA possesses both two and four-wheeler vehicles.
- BVHA has 2 Mobile Medical Units (Force Ambulance modified for MMU)
- A multimedia awareness van for community awareness programmes.
- Sufficient parking space is provided for motor bikes and cars, ensuring convenience for employees and visitors alike.



## Significant achievements over the past five years:

### Key Milestones of BVHA: Driving Positive Change in Bihar

1. **Empowering 300+ CSOs:** Over the last five years, BVHA has empowered more than 300 Civil Society Organizations, boosted their capacity and helped them become influential members of key forums and committees. This has strengthened civil society's role in driving impactful change across various sectors.
2. **Transforming Nutritional Health:** Through targeted interventions, BVHA has improved the nutritional health of 2,500 children, women, and adolescents by promoting growth monitoring, nutritious local foods, and kitchen gardening, effectively addressing malnutrition in marginalized communities.
3. **Mobilizing 300,000 Children for MR Vaccination:** BVHA's outstanding effort in mobilizing nearly 300,000 children for Measles-Rubella vaccinations across 26 districts of Bihar highlights its dedication to safeguarding children's health and supporting national immunization efforts.
4. **Supporting People with Disabilities:** BVHA provided critical support to 5,600 people with disabilities, including vaccinating 1,200 individuals against COVID-19, demonstrating a commitment to inclusivity and health equity for vulnerable populations.
5. **Leading in COVID Vaccination:** BVHA played a key role in achieving a 90% COVID vaccination rate in one block and ensured 6,400 individuals across four blocks were vaccinated, underscoring its leadership in public health initiatives during the pandemic.
6. **Eye Health for All:** BVHA has screened over 700,000 school children for eye issues and conducted 4,000 cataract surgeries, particularly benefiting the elderly, thereby improving vision and enhancing the quality of life for thousands.
7. **Standing Against Child Marriage:** By forming 600 adolescent groups and empowering 12,000 youth, BVHA has enabled young people to take a stand against child marriage while advocating for sexual and reproductive health rights.
8. **Disaster Relief & COVID-19 Support:** During critical times, BVHA provided essential relief to 10,000 families impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and various natural disasters, ensuring community resilience in times of crisis.
9. **Vocational Skills for Youth:** BVHA has trained 1,200 youth in vocational skills, enhancing their employability and enabling them to contribute to their families and communities' economic growth.
10. **Empowering Women in Agriculture & Livestock:** By supporting 4000 women in goat farming, back yard poultry and agricultural activities, BVHA is promoting economic independence and empowering women to lead sustainable livelihoods.
11. **Safe Drinking Water Access:** BVHA has installed 50 deep-bore hand pumps in flood and arsenic-affected villages, providing access to safe drinking water for

thousands. In addition, 2,000 water sources have been tested for arsenic, raising awareness among 25000 people about water safety.

**12. Domestic Violence Awareness:** BVHA has sensitized 1,000 women and girls in Patna's slums about domestic and gender-based violence, offering counselling and legal support to survivors, ensuring their safety and dignity.

**13. Engagement for Policy Change:** Through strategic engagement with government leaders and policymakers, BVHA has successfully advocated for policies that positively impact the health and well-being of communities across Bihar.

These milestones reflect BVHA's enduring commitment to improving lives, fostering sustainable development, and creating healthier, empowered communities.
